A Day in the Life of a Rabbit Volunteer

Hello, my name is Linda and I am a rabbit volunteer. In case you have ever wondered... this is what we do at the shelter. Every day we have a volunteer check on the rabbits and give them greens. They are on a strict diet and get only a small piece of carrot and fresh veggies like parsley, dandelion greens and romaine lettuce. Hay is the most important food they can eat. We tidy up their cages, check their litter boxes and water. At least one of the rabbits will always throw a toy or food in their water.

About 3-4 days a week, we “hop” the rabbits for exercise. We set up three to five pens about 8ft x 8ft square behind the rabbit house. Sheets are spread on the ground to keep the rabbits off the grass and sheets are on top to shade them from the sun and protect them from the hawks. There are boxes and tubes for them to play with and run through. The volunteers sit with them for socialization. When needed, we groom and trim their nails.

On hot days, they lay around a lot, but on cooler days, they zoom around and jump in the air. It is a lot of fun to watch them. They love their time outside.

One of our most important jobs is to answer questions, educate the public and screen would-be-adopters. Cindy, our head rabbit volunteer, is a bonding expert for pairs of rabbits. She has been very successful in many happy bonding adoptions.


We invite you to come back, visit with us, learn more about our rabbits and just watch the fun.

“The San Clemente–Dana Point Animal Shelter has an outdoor play and recreation area specifically designated for sick and elderly dogs. Unfortunately this area has been neglected and out of use for the last five years. The Shelter has a PVC tent frame and a canopy that provides shade, but the canopy continues to be non-functional due to heavy winds. I plan to repair and place a canopy, securing it so it is wind proof and functional to provide shade year round. The play yard needs to be renovated, repaired, weeded, leveled, cleaned, ground soil repaired and mulch installed. I want to make this area a safe, secure, healthy place where the animals can recover for illness or have a respite in the day in their old age. It will be a calm and pleasant environment for the dogs as well as the shelter volunteers who are assisting. I plan to carry out, fulfill, and complete these much needed repairs in a neat, efficient, orderly fashion.”

Fiesta 2010!!!



Marlowe, Feral Cat or Sweet Lap Kitty?

It was a warm September evening. Trying to trap 2 feral kittens, I got out of my car to check the traps. Instead of a kitten, there sat a dark, gray, fuzzy adult cat. Where did he come from? Though he was trapped at a regular feeding station, no one had ever seen this mysterious cat.

Once home, Marlowe hid at the back of his cage. Though scared stiff, he did respond by eating his plate of food immediately. This was my first clue Marlowe might not be feral.

Progress was slow. Though not hissing or swatting like a feral cat, Marlowe was not responding to my advances. Finally, after 3 weeks, he broke and started responding to my touch and purring. Once I brought him into my home, he continued to improve and was soon sleeping close to me in bed. It was very clear this poor guy had just been out there, on his own, for a very long time.

Though appearing to be very healthy, Marlowe tested positive for the Feline Immunodeficiency Virus. He also started behaving aggressively with the other cats in my household. Marlowe needed to be placed in a home with no other cats. Within a few weeks, we has adopted by an elderly friend who had just lost her husband. Together, they both began their journey of healing.

How did Marlowe end up on the streets? We will never know. In my twenty years of trapping cats, 30 – 40% of the cats I trap turn out not to be feral. In fact, they often are some of the sweetest, most lovable cats. A cat in a trap is not necessarily feral, nor unadoptable.
