"Zorro" The German Shorthaired Pointer

Our on site trainer Denise S'Bath, who is a big part of PPF's 3rd Chance Program, was evaluating a couple of dogs for rescue at a shelter in Riverside County. The young starving German Shorthaired Pointer had just been picked up and was about to be placed in a kennel as Denise was leaving. Despite being a bag of bones, the dog still had the energy left in him to jump up on her for hugs and kisses, which proved to be his salvation.

They said he was found wandering in the mountains, clearly starving for some time, as he was at least 20 pounds underweight. His chances at this shelter were not good. Facilities such as this one are dreadfully overcrowded, and they just do not have the resources to give extra care to dogs like ZORRO.

Denise just couldn't turn her back on this dog's plea for help, and soon she was loading him up with the other dogs she had rescued, immediately naming him ZORRO.

Once back at The San Clemente–Dana Point Animal Shelter ZORRO was placed in a heated kennel, given a cozy bed and fed his first square meal in a long time.

Unfortunately he broke with kennel cough after a few days, a result of his compromised immune system and that soon developed into a serious case of pneumonia. He spent a very expensive week in isolation at the vet's office being treated and medicated, but emerged healthy and well, ready for his forever home.

The GOOD NEWS, ZORRO is living in the lap of luxury with a family that sadly lost their beloved German Shorthaired Pointer last year and they had been looking on the internet at rescue facilities, hoping to find one!



Pet Project Foundation is delighted to welcome Kim into this position. She previously served as a supervisor and is very familiar with all aspects and workings of the Shelter.


PPF looks forward to working with Kim in her new capacity, particularly in our shared goal of building new kitty-friendly quarters at the Shelter in the upcoming year.


